During race week, the boat will be on display at **Morton's Market** (1924 South Osprey Ave., Sarasota) on Wednesday, June 27, 2012 from 10 a.m. to 2 p.m. and at **Fleming's Steakhouse** (1001 Siesta Dr., Sarasota) from 5-8 p.m. It will also be at the **10th Street Boat Pits** on Friday, June 29 and Saturday, June 30, 2012 between 10 a.m. and 9 p.m. The **Main Street Parade** starts at 7 p.m. on Friday, June 29. The **Watt-Ahh®** Boat will be competing in the second heat on Sunday, July 1, 2012 off Lido Beach.

"It is confusing for some new race fans on what boat actually has the lead in its class during the hotly contested races", says REDS Marine Engineer **Rob Gourley**.
