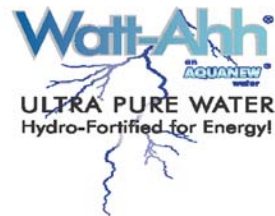

First Carbon Neutral Race Boat

Local race team, Driver Scott Brown and Trottleman Eddie Tamberino of Englewood, Florida will be competing for the World Championship in Key West this week. Their boat is the first known competitive race boat to receive a Carbon Neutral certification.

“We realized our partnership has a strong green consulting expertise and similar to the shoutout to the U.S. Troops in Afghanistan and Iraq over the 4th of July holiday, it is a natural for us to send this new environmental awareness message,” said Rob Gourley, CEO of AquaNew, L.L.C. and WIT International, L.L.C., both companies are located in Sarasota, Florida. Gourley further introduces a new member to the race boat partnership, Two Trails Inc. Green Building Consulting of Sarasota, Florida, are the sponsors of this carbon neutral race boat. Vice President, Debbie Smith said “We love boat racing, unfortunately the technology is not available to make a race boat this fast without using traditional fossil fuels. The next best alternative for the environment is to purchase carbon neutral credits from other energy sources. Purchasing these credits

supports energy produced by alternative energy sources like wind farms. This method is known as carbon offset. Carbon offset is the reduction of emissions from a source that creates carbon or greenhouse gasses. Essentially we have bought enough carbon neutral energy to replace the energy and carbon being used by the boat in each race. Every little bit of carbon off set can help. Being green does not always mean you can't love a super fast fossil burning boat, but it does help to be environmentally friendly to help offset the carbon produced."

In 2009, the race team of Brown and Tamberino captured first place in their class during the Sarasota July 4th race. Brown has recovered from a non-race related injury earlier this year and will be joining Tamberino for the Key West races. "Eddie and I will do our best to make a great showing for the growing number of sport boat racing fans."
